Shillong, May 15, 2025 : A felicitation ceremony to honour the toppers and meritorious students of the Secondary and Higher Secondary Examinations conducted by the Meghalaya Board of School Education (MBOSE) was held today at the Raj Bhavan, Shillong. The event also marked the celebration of the **Foundation Day of Sikkim**. The event was graced by **Shri C.P. Marak, IFS (retd.)**, Chairman of MBOSE, Shri Ryntihlang Rapthap, IAS, Commissioner and Secretary Education Department, Meghalaya, Shri M.
