I am personally interested in journalism. It should progress and elevate. There was a period when investigative journalism helped our country a lot.

What is the future of journalism? While we are concentrating on Investigative Journalism, we must also focus on Inspirational journalism. Common men should get inspiration for education, employment, healthcare, travel, tourism, social work through the media. Let us elevate journalism to new heights.

In the daily newspaper, at least one page should be allocated for positive information, real incidents and news. You can also allot the front page for some positive news which would brighten the day of the readers.

On my part, I give all my support and best wishes to MEPA in its future endeavours and if you need any help you are free to come to me at any time. My doors are always open. I will definitely help you with whatever I can within my capacity.
