## SPEECH OF THE HONOURABLE GOVERNOR OF MEGHALAYA SHRI C H VIJAYASHANKAR FOR GANDHI JAYANTI ON 2<sup>TH</sup> OCTOBER 2024 DURBAR HALL RAJ BHAVAN SHILLONG
